The Food Pantry has not been receiving as many of these items from the food banks and has found themselves having to purchase food for their shelves.

In light of this updated need, monetary donations are certainly welcome! The Food Pantry also accepts donations of <u>unopened</u>, <u>non-perishable</u> food and supplies.

The church is open Mon-Fri from 8:00 am—1:00 pm. Grocery carts are located in the Fellowship Hall & by the ramp door and a red wagon is located in the Narthex for your item donations.

#### **CEO's GROUP**


The CEO Group will hold their 11th fellowship meal on **Wed**, **March 26** at **5:30 pm** at **Café Fontana**.


