doscope of colors and beauty that amazes us year after year. Soon the leaves will fade in their beauty and begin to drop to the ground. Most of us will begin looking forward to the upcoming holidays and the ultimate gathering of family and friends, food, celebration and worship. Yes, the onset of fall brings much to our world.

Perhaps just as fall brings change to our world; we need to offer a little change in our own lives and perspective on faith. Jesus said this in "The Sermon on the Mount" "You are the salt of the earth, but if the salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet."

In our day we take salt for granted we can buy it at the store for a very marginal price, but in Jesus time salt was of great value. In an agrarian society like ancient Palestine money had its place and held value, however, salt for most people was of the greatest value. In Jesus' time you didn't have the luxury of modern refrigeration or canning to preserve food. So, salt takes on a different level of importance for most, thus, the statement "you are the salt of the earth."

Notice Jesus' words, "you are the salt of the earth." "You are," is the operative portion of this phrase. As followers of Christ we have no choice in the matter. It is cast upon us whether we like it or not. Jesus didn't say you may, should, might, think about it, will be, or any other moniker you can think of but that "you are the salt of the earth." This should change our perspective about faith and following Christ. Contrary to popular thought we are not Christians to be consumers of God and the church, but to be preservers of this world and those who bring flavor to God's creation. Yes, salt preserves but it also enhances flavor. Christians are to have this type of affect on the world, but how?

As preservers we are not to be influenced by the world but to influence the world through our faith and walk with Christ. We do this by being true Disciples of Christ. In his last command known as "The Great Commission" (Matthew 28: 16-20) Jesus set the path for his church. We are to make disciples. Yes, followers of Jesus Christ not consumers of entertainment or services of the church but followers. We preserve this world by walking, talking and acting like Jesus in every aspect of our life all one needs do to discover this truth is to read the entire "Sermon on the Mount". This means Jesus is not just our savior but our lord as well. Everyone wants a savior but few of us want a lord. He must be both. Even though the world may not know it and may reject us or not desire our presence it needs God's people to preserve order, morality and love.

As flavor, we should be examples of God's love joy and peace. Sin brings death in this life and the next, however, through Jesus Christ we have new life and so can the entire world. Christ is the catalyst and change maker for new life. How many of us were lost bound by the weight of sin and this world and freed by Christ? Jesus can change even the most hardened or depraved individual into an ambassador of love and hope for a hurting and dying world. Look at the Apostle Paul. He was a persecutor of the church and an ardent enemy of the early church. Just one encounter with Jesus Christ and the persecutor and murderer know as Saul was transformed into a faithful slave of Christ named Paul. Before his conversion this man wrought havoc, fear and death upon God's people; but after he became a mentor and loving influence upon untold multitudes.

We are the salt of the earth and perhaps with the change of the weather, we can make a change from our often ineffectual and consumer minded faith to one of preserver and flavor for the Kingdom of God.



The Mission/Social Committee continues to support Soles4Souls through benevolences and donations. Our committee recently received a check from Helping Hands/Cross Word Café for \$1,265.39 which represents a portion of a week's profit in their store. That generous donation was sent to Soles4Souls along with First Lutheran's benevolence of \$1000.00. We have decided NOT to collect and send shoes at this time; HOWEVER, shoes can still be donated in two ways:

- 1. Shoes can be dropped off at any DSW shoe store. The closest DSW shoe store is located in Bloomington across from Eastland Mall on Route 9 near Home Goods and Dick's Sporting Goods.
- 2. Another way to donate shoes is to go to the Soles4Souls website at "soles4souls.org". Click on the box labeled "Ship for free". There you will find instructions on how to box them up and print a free shipping label. Boxes can be dropped off at Advance Auto Parts near Baby Bull's. We formerly used PST, but unfortunately they now add a surcharge to ship via UPS from there.

The quilting ladies at First Lutheran have been working diligently all year putting together beautiful quilts that will benefit people here in the US and all over the world. THANK YOU!!!! If you have, or do, share your time, talent or treasure (working on quilts, donating fabric, thread, etc. or share information about the ministry, etc.), you are a part of this ministry. The quilt ministry schedule is very FLEXIBLE. The ministry currently meets on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons and all day on Saturday. They are currently 10 women working on the quilts --- some work at church, some work at home and some work both places. As needed throughout the year, some of the guilts are delivered locally to police, fire and ambulance services. This year we began delivering some of the guilts to the NALC Disaster Services Warehouse in Rantoul (currently all of their services are provided domestically). Also, each year the First Lutheran high school graduates receive a quilt from their church family. Recently, the Mission/Social Committee shared guilts to the two seminary students that First Lutheran supports. Again, THANK YOU!!! THANK YOU!!! to everyone who is helping First Lutheran "serve our neighbors".
